I only stayed one semester at the University of Massachusetts. The orientation days for internationals were very helpful, as we got a lot of useful information and met other internationals. There were a lot of people from Baden-Württemberg.

Although I first wanted to take more computer science courses, I was glad that I ended up in the economics faculty, as it had mostly PhD students and it is a heterodox faculty, so it was very different to Freiburg.

Luckily, I found housing before arriving to Massachusetts. I was staying in a student dorm off-campus in a very good location between the town center and the campus. My dorm was the main highlight of my experience. I lived in Jewish community during my stay, and I really tried to be an active member of the community. I attended a Tora course every Wednesday, went occasionally to shabbat and participated in almost all holidays. Living in a Jewish community after the 7th of October also was at times very hard. The community was devastated, and we were very scared about our safety and the one of other Jewish students on campus. So, I think the best and the hardest experience was living at a Jewish community after the terrorist attacks in Israel. I really liked being part of a community, nobody tried to convert me or change who I was, and I always felt welcome. My classes and the approachability of the professors was also very important.

At first, I applied for UBC in Vancouver because it is my favorite city and as a teenager, I had spent some time there. I really did not want to go to the USA, as I have never had interest in going there and I am very critical of the lifestyle there and the large inequality. However, I am glad that I ended up going to Massachusetts as my experience was better than all the expectations and prejudices that I had of the USA. The organization from both the side of Freiburg and the university abroad was good. I could communicate anything with the organizer in Freiburg and she was very responsive and helpful.

What I liked most about Massachusetts are the people, the beautiful fall, and the Jewish community. I liked the least the expensive housing prices and food prices and maybe also that without a car it is difficult to travel.

I would say as a practical tip start looking for housing early and try to find your own community in Massachusetts, it will add towards your experience.

I really am very helpful for the international office for organizing and all the smooth communication. I felt save and supported at all times although being very far from home.
