
SEARCH FOR COURSES

How do I find the right courses in terms of content and language for my studies at the University of Freiburg?


First of all, the best way is to use the information provided by the respective Erasmus+ Departmental Coordinator. You can find the links to this information via the list of <u>Erasmus+ Departmental Coordinators</u>. If you want to search independently, the following information will certainly help you.

1. Go to the homepage of the Campus Management System of the University of Freiburg (HISinOne) and choose your language (English):




- 2. Choose the green quicklink "Search for courses" on the left.
- 3. Choose "Show all possible search criteria".
- 4. Make sure the appropriate semester is set.



- 5. Choose the appropriate "Teaching language", e.g. "Deutsch" oder "English".
- 6. In order to find the right courses for your field of studies, you must select the appropriate "Organizational unit" at the University of Freiburg. Proceed as follows:
 - a) Click on "Select" below the "Organizational unit" field.
 - b) Open via the arrow symbol "Albert Ludwigs-Universität Freiburg"
 - c) Open via the arrow symbol "Faculties"
 - d) Search for the faculty that suits you, e.g. "Faculty of Biology" and select both boxes on the left in the columns "Selection" and "Selection with sub-elements".
 - e) Choose "Carry over the selection" at the top left.



- 7. You are back in the "Search for courses" view. Now choose "Search" on the bottom left.
- 8. You will receive a list of search results with number, title, term, lecturer, etc. The "Kind of course" column provides information on whether it is a lecture, seminar, exercise, etc.



9. Click on the title for more information.

- a) Now check in the "Modules / Courses of study" tab to find out whether this course is intended for your level of study.
- b) For example, if in the tab "Associated courses of study"
 - (1) Bachelor's degree programs but no Master's degree programs are listed, it is a course for Bachelor's students;
 - (2) if Master's degree programs but no Bachelor's degree programs" are listed, it is a course for Master's students;
 - (3) if both Bachelor's and Master's degree programs are listed, the course is open to students at both levels.
