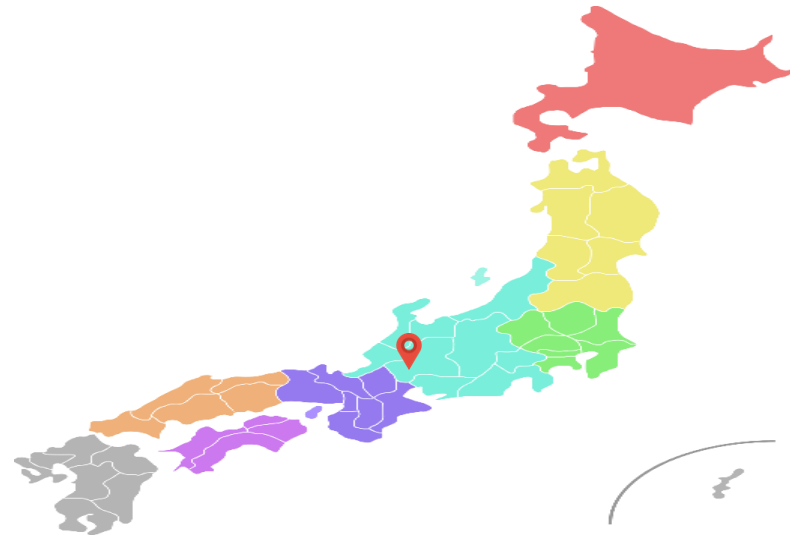
Located in the center of Japan

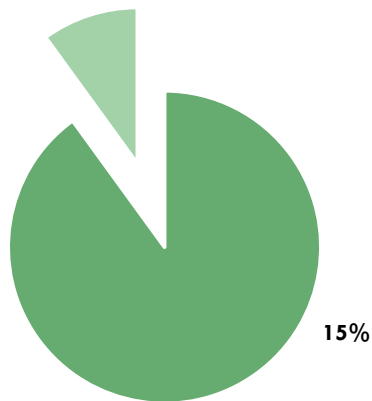

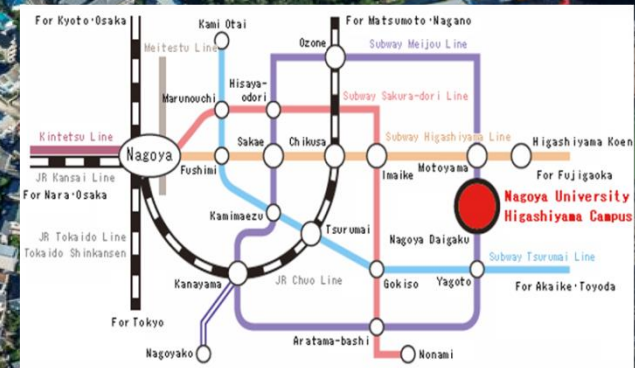

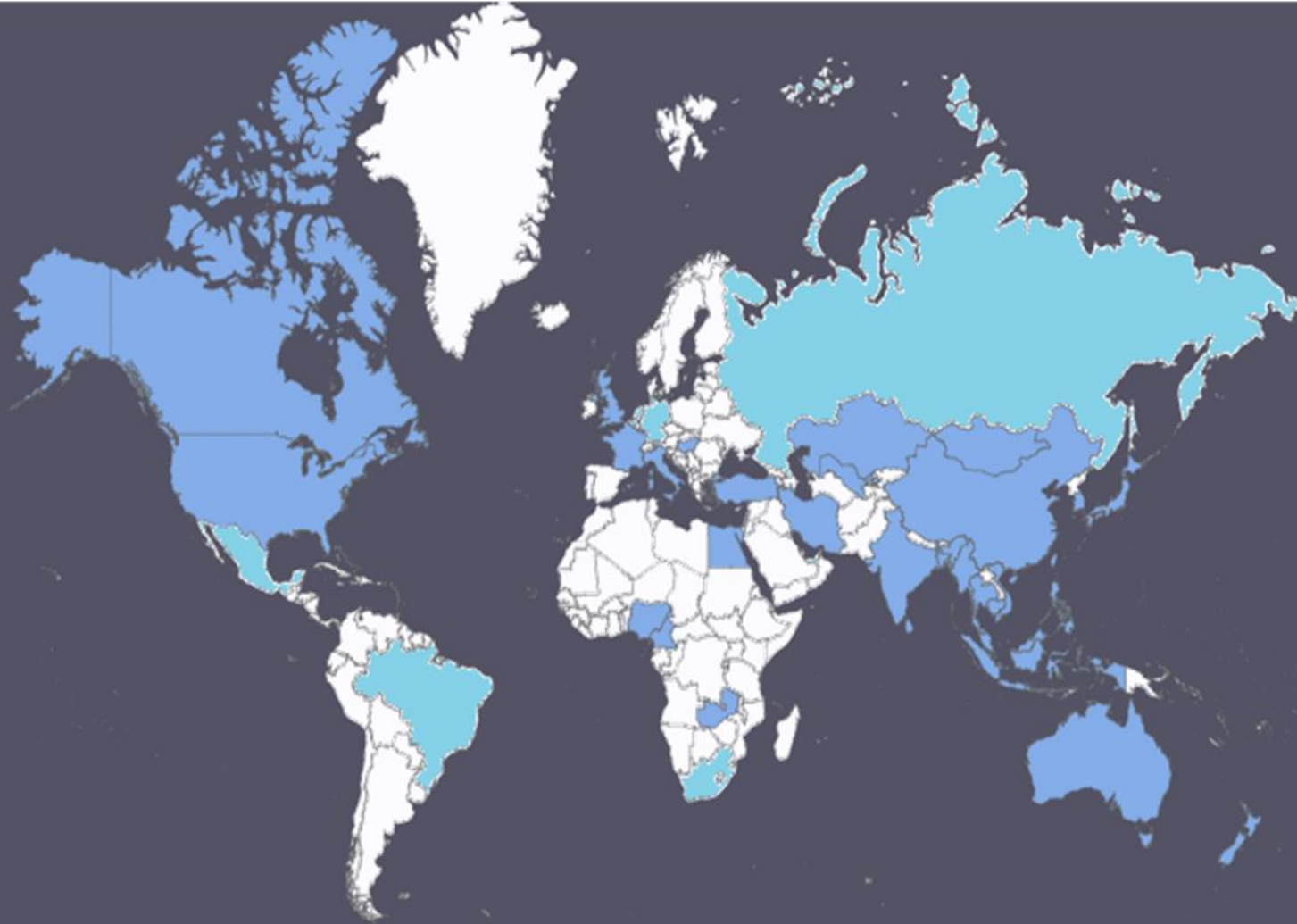
